

MEET THE OWNER – SAMUEL MACE AND HIS VOLVO S90

I have a brand affinity for Volvo as my dad owned a succession of them, and I was in the market for a C70 convertible. However. Facebook Marketplace's algorithm presented me with this, and I wanted it the moment I saw it! It had been listed for 11 minutes when I enquired. I drove down to view it the next day, and it came home with me. I have craved a 960/S90 for years but never seemed to find one worth having or that was not stupid money.



And at last, Samuel Mace owns a 1998 S90, the final incarnation of the 960 and arguably the swan song of the 'traditional' large Volvos. Twenty-six years ago, your Ford dealer might have offered you a tempting discount on a soon-to-be discontinued Scorpio, but it lacked the S90's pomp and circumstance. Our Volvo enthusiast might also dismiss a Lexus as a transport for Alan Partridge-style motorists. The Rover 800 looked appealingly formidable but did not quite match the S90's air of being hewn from granite. Volvo partially devised the 960 for the US market, and *The New York Times* described it as: "A box

That "A Box That's Well Rounded". Their viewer also found it "a quiet, comfortable handler that is fully endearing". As for Samuel's view of his mighty 2.9-litre saloon:

Despite the fact that it uses the same kind of rear suspension as a C4 Corvette, a fact that Volvo crammed down your throat at every opportunity, it is still a bit dull to drive. Stable, and BMW E38-like in its hunkered down feel, but still a bit dull. Yet, it has road presence. Nobody tailgates you, even if you take it easy, while it is in a great colour, rust-free and feels like a car with decades ahead of it. As for the S90's construction:

The body is built like a warship, while the interior is more like a National Trust property interior. Everything creaks, everything feels like it is about to break, everything is UV damaged, and you get told off if you sit on the wrong seat. Then again, the wood in National Trust properties does not look like it's been bought by the yard and cut from a roll. Above all, Samuel appreciates the styling:

It is obvious Volvo were desperately trying to paste Peter Horbury's softer new design language over the last remaining brick, which was still kicking around. This sort of facelift reminds me of a council doing a half-baked facelift on a Brutalist shopping centre they would dearly love to rip down. They tried throwing in an atrium here, a neo-gothic pillar there - but we know it is still full of asbestos and hiding '70s technology.

Such a description, as well as evoking nightmares of Portsmouth's Tricorn Centre with Neo-Tudor decorations, reminds the S90 was a direct descendant of 1969 164. In addition, the British Volvo buyer of 1998 would probably have been a Wolseley customer four decades earlier; indeed, the 6/99 inspired the 164's grille. Both marques embodied quiet dignity, discreet taste, and covert mockery of Ford and Vauxhall owners. Meanwhile, Samuel finds his S90: More than lives up to expectations. It hugs the road in a Jaguar-like fashion, which I wasn't expecting, and soothes in a way I wasn't expecting. It also has a surprisingly rev-hungry engine and very secure handling – and inspires mindful, courteous driving. A Volvo owner would expect nothing less.

There is no answer to that! (The true fact was that it was **NOT the same 480** I had travelled up the Show in

However, the real barn find was Kevins 1980s ITERA plastic bike.

Three rare Volvos made an appearance—Joe Paynter's 242GT 1980: Graham Silverton's 440 XI 1993: and the Lovegrove's 245 Pickup. Kevin's daughters (Treena and Kerris) sent along their 1927 pedal car JAKOB. Making another appearance cunningly disguised in the old Leicestershire Constabulary livery was Kevins V70 T5 Estate (2002) complete with authorisation from the late Chief Constable for its use.

The Volvo Trucks Division of the Club at this show was represented by Stuart Keedwell's N12 330 BHP 1977 Tractor Unit delivered by Club Member Clive Davies who has an F86, previously displayed on one of our NEC Stands and also an F88, both preserved in Keedwell's livery.

A really interesting piece of history. The cab is not sat on the engine making it look like those American tractor units you see in the movies with huge bonnets. I'm told that the reason you don't see this type of vehicle in the UK is due to the restricted length of the full rig on UK roads.



The last of the cars was 'Old Banger's 1967 P1800S. The number of punters who walked up (unaided) humming the theme to The Saint was impressive seeing that the series finished in 1969 (56 years ago by my reckoning) but apparently its being rerun on some channels somewhere. Hence the preponderance of the under 70's getting used to the fact that Volvo could build beautiful cars. Talking of under 70s, any younger members interested in helping erect, dismantle, and/or man the stand at the NEC (or other) shows please contact El Presidente as we Minions are getting older and more doddery (as are our carers—see picture building display on the first page of this article).

Statistics are only available for last year's show: attendance over the three days - 71,250, vehicle on show - 3,000 and Clubs present 338. but this year's figures must be similar, so if you've never been, give it a go.

Our next outing at the NEC is the Lancaster Classic Car Show in November —unless El Presidente is thinking of taking over somewhere Nordik (Greenland?)—conspiracy theorists discuss. The vehicle details follow. **'Old Banger'**

The Vehicles on our Display:

1993 Volvo 440Xi 1.7 Petrol Automatic: I bought this car last October, I am still not sure why, but I really quite like it and my wife even more so. I had to prize the key from her hand to get it here today. First registered on 23/04/1993 from Anca Volvo in Brighton, the 440 lived in and around Sussex from then un I I bought it and drove it to its new home in Lincolnshire. I travelled by train to Burgess Hill in Sussex to collect it and the owner was amazed that I was driving it home as he said "it hasn't been out Burgess Hill in decades" It only has just over 65,000 miles on it, with an incredible full service history, and whilst it will never be a show queen it has proved reliable and different enough to provoke the conversa on of "you don't see many of



those anymore" on several occasions. Work in the future will be to conserve rather than restore, the plastic sill covers will be coming off soon to treat any nasties that may be hiding underneath. A recent new cam belt gives me peace of mind to drive it anywhere whilst listening to Bonnie Tyler on the original Volvo Radio Casse e player. Owned by **Graham Silverton - LincoInshire**

A Unique Car - the ONLY Volvo 242GT sold in the UK: The 242 GT was a special edition (sports oriented) version

of the 240 series, available only in 2-door sedan in limited markets including Europe (LHD) and Australia (RHD) from 1978 through to 1981. It is suggested that the car was originally designed to compete with the BMW 323i, but there were plenty of other relevant competitors in this sector such as high spec versions of the Opel Commodore C, Ford Corona and of course its home-grown competitor, the Saab 99. In any event, the aim of the 242 GT was to shake off Volvo's "safe and boring" image, and to achieve that on a small budget. The 242 GT ended up being the start of greater things to come including the GLT, GLT Turbo and the 240 Turbo Evolution. These later developments of the 242



chassis led to great success in touring car racing globally, with victory for the 240 Turbo in the 1985 European Touring Car Championship. The later success of racing bricks really did start with the 242 GT. This Volvo 242GT, is the ONLY one sold new in the UK. It was a 'Special Order' by the owner. Displayed 'as found', the car will return to future shows when a full restoration has been completed by the present owner. **Owned by Joe Paynter - Worcestershire**

Volvo 1800S 1967: The technical stuff first:- Chassis No: 24062. Engine No: 3072. First registered 10/05/1967 to

a lady in St Helens, Lancashire (as it was then) transferred to her son in law 1977, I acquired it from him on 01/10/1979 having badgered him to sell it to me from when he acquired it (we used the same car park for work, so it was a daily request!).

I suspect like many I fell in love with the car on seeing it drive across a black and white TV screen (my Gran's) with Roger Moore in 'The Saint'. In my case as a 13 year old in 1963.

The original colour was white with a black interior and still is. It was used daily until the 1980's when I acquired a works car and it was garaged until 2015 when retirement loomed and two friends, expert in restoring old vehicles as a hobby (Eddie Heywood and Frank Serpe), took me and the car in hand.



We did a back to bare metal restoration, the bodywork was done professionally but we rebuilt the engine and replaced all working parts which could not be restored e.g. all brake lines, clutch lines, most of the external trim and grill and retrimmed all the interior except the roof lining. The two front seats were professionally rebuilt but the rear is original, the radiator was rebuilt by a firm in Widnes.

Doing the work part time took us about three years - we had just started to enjoy the car when the Covid lock down hit.

The car has recently been fitted with Electric Power Steering and Aluminium Engine Timing Gears. **Owned by Keith Jones - Cheshire**

Volvo 480 Celebration 1995: The Volvo 480 was launched to the motoring Press in 1985. The model would be Volvo's first Front Wheel Drive Car, suspension designed by Lotus and the Engine and Drive Train from Renault but would be tuned with a cylinder head reworked by Porche. Built and designed in The Volvo Plant in Born,



Holland, the first production car rolled off the production line in 1986. The car became very popular in the UK, which in the end was the market where most were sold. However poor quality, water leaks, problems with the electronics and rust meant that few survive today. In 1995 to celebrate the end of production, Volvo produced a limited-edition model, called the 480 Celebration – 480 Units were produced with each one individually numbered * of 480. A plate was placed on the dash of each car stating which number of the 480 the car was. This particular Volvo 480 Celebration 1995, being

number 357 of the 480 produced. Purchased as a non-runner and thus barn find, the car over the show weekend was worked on by Club Members to prepare for the MOT and get the engine running – we hoped! Which was

not the case – still not running after replacing many parts! **Owned by Kevin Price - Worcestershire Volvo 245 Pickup:** This Volvo is UNIQUE as it started life as a 245 Estate 2.0 automatic. This was converted into a pickup, along with a full body/ underbody restoration, by Squire Furneaux Volvo Dealership, as an internal trainee exercise. Previous owner swapped in a B230E engine + a M47 manual gearbox. Have owned and enjoyed this unique pickup for two years. Owned by **Robert & Louise Lovegrove - Worcestershire**

JAKOB Pedal Car - Volvo's first car: an open tourer, came off the production line on 14th April, 1927 and was named 'Jakob', a Volvo OV4. It was the brainchild of Gustaf Larson, an engineer, and Assar Gabrielsson a Bachelor of Science in Economics,



who founded, with the financial help of SKF Bearings the car company 'Volvo' – a name given to the company by SKF, which in Latin means 'I Roll'. **Owners: Treena & Kerris Price, Cornwall**

THAT POLICE CAR Volvo V70 T5 'FL02 XFN': started service with Leicestershire Constabulary in July 2002. Her

primary use was a Traffic Unit based at Oakham and saw service mainly on the M1 Motorway. After being decommissioned she was sold and had 7 more private owners before I purchased the vehicle in February 2017, with the intention of returning the car to its full original Police operational specification for use as an exhibition vehicle at Car Shows. Since purchase I have been trying to locate all the items require to transform a standard looking Volvo V70 back to its original operational specification. As a private individual I am able to use the car on public roads providing the Light Bar and all 'POLICE' signs are covered. I am still looking for Police items for the car e.g. foldable signs. If you can help in any way or have history on this car, please

THE REAL BARN FIND: Back in December 1977, Volvo in Gothenburg wanted to produce minicars and they investigated conditions and designs. By January 1978, Volvo had started to use plastic composite materials for many of the parts in their cars and other products were considered, a bicycle one of them. In October 1978, a grant of SEK 54,000 from the Swedish National Board for Technical Development financed a prototype plastic bicycle. By February 1980, a rideable bicycle was demonstrated to the state-owned bank and a loan of SEK 6

million was granted. In March 1980, Itera Development Centre AB was born to design, produce, and market compositematerial bicycles. 1981 saw the first bicycles being shown to retailers and the press, with Nation-wide advertising being scheduled for spring 1982. The bikes were delivered unassembled with tools provided in the box. Bikes were available in a range of funky colours including pink, turquoise and orange, with beige being the most popular production colour. Besides the standard bike, a racing/sports model was also produced with the usual dropped steel handlebars. Later produced standard cycles also lost their plastic handlebars. By



the autumn 1981, more than 100,000 Swedes indicated they were interested and in February 1982 production started in Vilhelmina. Sales were slow and the news media lost interest. The fact that not every box contained every part to assemble a bicycle frustrated many customers. Production ended in 1985. Approximately 30,000 Itera bicycles were produced. The final stock was sold to the Caribbean region where they became popular as rust is a problem with metal bicycles and were hugely successful. This Itera Bike was found in a barn along with another in pieces. Both are the rare turquoise coloured bike. The intention is to keep the bike in this 'as found' condition but recommission it back 'on the road'. If you wish to obtain one of these bikes, spares are almost impossible to find. Keys for the fitted lock often are missing, mudguards broken and lights missing or damaged. So try to find the best you can, with prices around £200 on Ebay, it's a great piece of Volvo history and also a talking point at classic vehicle shows **Owned by Kevin Price - Worcestershire**

Volvo N12 Turbo 6 - 330 BHP Tractor Unit: Produced only in Left Hand Drive, the same as the Volvo F89 It was Imported from Portugal, and was at restorer Nobby Caister's near Dover, who had just restored our Scania 142, Stuart Keedwell for some reason took a liking to it so Nobby done it in Keedwell livery. Because it was allocated a West Wales Registration, people seem to think it had a previous life here, but not true. This lorry was named 'Blue Mule 11' after and F88 290 we had in the 1970's which Ray's brother Robbin drove. Ray named the F88 after 'Blue Mule' a er watching a 70's film 'White Line Fever' which featured a truck called 'Blue Mule' Owned by Stuart Keedwell -R. T. Keedwell Group - Somerset

Lucas Electrical Theory:

Many readers from older generations may remember that up to the late 1960's nearly all car imports came from the UK and were generally fitted with Lucas electrical equipment. Here are some comments about their products. Positive ground depends on proper circuit

functioning, which is the transmission of



negative ions by retention of visible spectral manifestation known as "smoke". Smoke is the thing that makes electrical circuits work. We know this to be true because every time one lets the smoke out of an electrical circuit, it stops working.

This can be verified repeatedly through empirical testing. For example, if one places a copper bar across the terminals of a battery, prodigious quantities of smoke are liberated and the battery shortly ceases to function. In addition, if one observes smoke escaping from an electrical component such as a Lucas voltage regulator, it will also be observed that the component no longer functions. The logic is elementary and inescapable!

The function of the wiring harness is to conduct the smoke from one device to another. When the wiring springs a leak and lets all the smoke out of the system, nothing works afterward. Starter motors were considered unsuitable for British motorcycles for some time largely because they consumed large quantities of smoke, requiring very unsightly large wires.

It has been reported that Lucas electrical components are possibly more prone to electrical leakage than their Bosch, Japanese or American counterparts. Experts point out that this is because Lucas is British, and all things British leak. British engines leak oil, British shock absorbers, hydraulic forks and disk brake systems leak fluid, British tires leak air and





British Intelligence leaks national defence secrets.

Therefore, it follows that British

electrical systems must leak smoke. Once again, the logic is clear and inescapable. In conclusion, the basic concept of transmission of electrical energy in the form of smoke provides a logical explanation of the mysteries of electrical components especially British units manufactured by Joseph Lucas, Ltd. (This has also been referred to as the "smoke theory" because when the smoke comes out its finished, cooked or done for.)

And remember: "A gentleman does not motor about after dark." Joseph Lucas "The Prince of Darkness" 1842-1903

A few Lucas quips:

The Lucas motto: "Get home before dark." Lucas is the patent holder for the short circuit. Lucas - Inventor of the first intermittent wiper. Lucas - Inventor of the self-dimming headlamp. The three-position Lucas switch--DIM, FLICKER and OFF. The other three switch settings--SMOKE, SMOLDER and IGNITE. The Original Anti - Theft Device - Lucas Electrics.

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

Good afternoon Kevin Hope this email finds you well.

As you might remember from our last communication, I've currently got the 1800E in bits and on ramps. I've done the spigot

bearing on the end of the crank and now doing the cylinder head off job to convert to unleaded. I shall be taking the head to Fleetwood this week to get the exhaust seats machined etc.

As I'm sure you know, the head needs lining back up with Volvo tool SVO 2435. Is this something VEC has for me to borrow please. Alternatively, is it possible for you to send me a sketch of the tool and I can possibly get 2 made by my contacts. Thanks in advance. Regards Mark.

Kevin Replies:

Hi Mark, Good to hear from you.

Re SVO 2435, I have always used 2 old head bolts with the heads cut off and a hacksaw slot to remove once head is in position. Never had a problem. If you want to borrow mine happy to put in post. Just let me know when you need them.

If you want to make them the Thread is 7/16 UNC and they are parallel with a sight taper on the top end to help going through holes in head. I have not got the genuine Volvo tools but mine have done a lot of engines now, without ANY problems.

Hope this helps, All the best, Kevin

Update from Mark:

Morning Kevin, Thanks for your advice. Now I know that, I've found 2 bolts identical in my 'stock' from a Ford Orion diesel job I did years ago which I can modify. The thread is the same (7/16 UNC), same length. I've measured the holes in the head and they're roughly 12mm diameter, so I'll get the head of the 2 bolts turned down to 12mm, put a screwdriver slot in and jobs a gudun.

Subject: Why Should I use Genuine Volvo Oil Filters on my 1966 Volvo 121 B18?

Hello Kevin, As a new Member to the Volvo Enthusiasts Club and Volvo Ownership, I read in various books/articles, that I should always use a genuine Volvo Oil Filter on my Volvo B18 Engine.

Could you please explain why and also, can I use an alternative. Many Thanks John H

Kevin Replies:

Hi John, This has been a regular question over the years and my response has always the same, but here is a brief response.

When the Volvo B18 was first developed from cutting a B36 V8 Truck Engine in half, to form a 4cyl B18, it was found, under test that there was premature failure of the Crank and Big End Bearings. The cause was found to be that oil was running back into the sump when engine stopped causing lack of lubrication (starvation) on startup. This was caused by there not being a non-return valve in the Oil Pump. Volvo's solution was to add a non-return valve in the Oil Filter which solved the problem.

So, by purchasing a Genuine Volvo Filter you are definitely getting a filter with a Non-Retum Valve enclosed. Mann Filters also produce the correct filter but beware the Ford Pinto 4cyl OHC uses an identical looking filter and used on lots of other vehicles, which does not contain a Non-return valve and if fitted can cause starvation of lubrication on start-up of engines and thus damage.

In the end the choice is yours, I have a 1962 P1800, affectionally known has 'HAB' which has covered over 750,000 miles on its original B18B Engine and I have ALWAYS used Genuine Volvo Filters since purchase in 1985 and previously by Volvo Full-Service History. Hi Kevin, Two quick questions if I can,

1/ Should the carburettor diaphragm on an early 360 be changed as a Service item or would you not be too concerned about changing it if its age is unknown and if you would recommend changing it do you know where would be a good place to get a good quality replacement?

2/ I am slightly confused about the age a car becomes eligible for Historic Taxation Class (I did read the article in the last issue magazine) so if a car was first registered 07/05/1985 but DVLA have on their records the car was manufactured 04/02/1985what date do you consider the car would be eligible for Historic Vehicle Taxation Class? Hopefully that all makes sense and thank you in advance for your reply. Regards Edward

Kevin Replies: Firstly – Stromberg Carburettor Diaphragm replacement:

Hi Edward, Good to hear from you. I change the Diaphragm every year, particularly with the Ethanol in fuel. I also always carry a spare in the car and a cross headed (Phillips) Screwdriver so can change o the road if needed.

If you do get a split in the diaphragm the engine will not run or sometimes will only just tickover. Ethanol can rot the diaphragm if it's not E10 compliant (normal Unleaded Fuel)

I bought my spare on Ebay from a reputable Classic Range Rover Specialist – these also use Stromberg Carbs on some models but checked their stocks were E10 Compliant – You could also use Burlen Fuel Systems in Salisbury who are SU and Stromberg Specialists




FIG 2:6 Diaphragm replacement on Stromberg carburetter showing left, the tabs and recesses on the piston and right, the tabs and recesses in the body. The diaphragm is secured to the piston by a ring and four screws and to the body by the clamping of suction chamber on the body

AND - Historic Vehicle Taxation: Re DVLA, because your car was built after 8th January 1985, your car will not become MOT and Tax Exempt until 1st April 2026. I have the same problem with my 245DL 'BUL'.

To qualify, vehicle has to be 40 years old (Built) before 8th January in any year and will be made exempt on the following 1st April. Your 360 was not built until 4th February 1985 so will not become MOT and Tax exempt until 1st April 2026. Hope this all helps. Kevin



Volvo B20 Block Drain Bung Replacement with Brass Tap – Mark Barnett (May fit other Volvo Engine Blocks so a useful conversion)

Well, whilst doing the conversion to unleaded and with the head off at the machine shop, I wanted to ensure the waterways around the cylinders were clean and free of debris. I thought that there

must be a way out for the sitting water around the cylinders for easy flushing and maintenance of the cooling system.

After a little investigation, I discovered a non-metal bung just rear of the oil filter. Using a ¼" Allen key the bung came out remarkably and surprisingly easy and the sitting water poured out. Without realising at that





point, that the hole in the block had a thread in it, I looked on line for a replacement bung without success.

I rang Simon at Brookhouse and although they don't sell the bung or a tap, he confirmed that there should be a thread and that it was a ¼" NPT (National Pipe Tapered). Again, I went online and as the Volvo blocks are used in the marine industry, I was able to purchase a brass tap from a marine suppliers.

Using a 14mm or 9/16" socket, the main body of the tap went in easily and tightened on the taper.


I did actually make a tool to tighten the tap because the tap is awkward to get at.

So. from now on, I know the cooling system will be easier to maintain going forward.



Volvo's Contribution to Road and Vehicle Safety – A section in the Club Magazine where we look at the contribution Volvo has made to Vehicle and Road Safety – This Issue – 1998 Whiplash Protection System and the Inflatable Curtain Whiplash Protection

System (WHIPS) is a system to protect against automotive whiplash injuries introduced by Volvo in

1998. It was launched when the Volvo S80 was released for the 1999 model year and has since been part of the standard equipment of all new Volvo cars.

A WHIPS equipped seat is designed so that the entire backrest helps to protect the front occupant's neck in a case of a rear impact. When the system is deployed, the front seat backrests and headrests are lowered backward to change the seating position of the driver and front seat passenger.

The main energy is absorbed via a pivot at the base of the seat—mechanism which allows the seat to move around the occupant's actual hip joint while moving rearward to absorb additional energy. A



piece of metal inside the backrest hinge deforms, absorbing more energy. The hinge piece needs to be replaced after having been deployed/






According to Volvo's traffic accident research team, the WHIPS equipped seat resulted in a 33% reduction in short term injury and a 54% reduction in long term whiplash injuries caused by car accidents. 1998 was a strong year for Volvo

safety, as not only did they introduce the WHIPS, which continues to prevent injuries worldwide, but they also introduced inflatable curtain airbags. These innovative airbags deploy in the event of a side impact or roll-over to better protect occupants, and are concealed in the headliners, so you'll never see them unless you need them. This was the first system to protect both front and rear-seat occupants.

As mentioned before, the Side Impact Protection System, or SIPS, became much more effective





at protecting occupants with addition of the inflatable side curtain airbag system. This effectively gave occupants a reinforced, cushioned shell that helped prevent fatal and not -fatal injuries from occurring during accidents.

The inflatable side curtains are mounted in the sides of the Headlining
