The origins of which are medieval and in the 15th century it was famous for housing a Prince of Wales later to be dispatched as one of the 'Princes in the Tower' allegedly by Richard III — Fun historical fact.

Speaking of which Kevin organised what had to be the best pitch on the site for us, just by the entrance to the Transport Display and backing onto said bar. Our club stand comprised Kevin's Leicestershire Police V70 T5 estate in full livery and full of genuine Police kit, Kevin's P1800 - the



genuine Saint Car as seen on TV, Robert and Louise Lovegrove's 1966 white P1800S, Old Banger's white 1967 P1800S (thus showing all of the types of P1800 used in the Saint TV series) visitors were asked to spot the differences (see answers below), Patrick Bunn's beautiful blue Volvo 164 saloon and bringing up the left hand side of the display Nick Dimarco's rare Volvo military communications vehicle from 1957/8, a Volvo TP21 Radio Car ex Swedish Army, often known as the Sugga (Sow) due to

1.Cow-horn bumpers on the early car—straight on the 1965 & 1967 model.

2.Chrome running strip down the side of the two earlier cars runs up to the door handle following the body line—thinner stainless-steel strip runs straight on the 1967 car.

3.Volvo badge by the rear quarter light on the Saint car - signifying that it was one of the first production models which were built by Jensen Motors in the UK - not on the two later cars. 4. Interior on the Jense built car

different design. 5 Volvo built cars painted in a Volvo Paint colour 'Pear White', Jensen built, because British, painted in UK Car Colours – this one 'Old English White'. 6. 




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## Volvo Enthusiasts Club 'National Gathering' held on Sunday 1st June 2025

# TV's 'The Saint' at 60 – Restoration Continues – 13<sup>th</sup> September 2007Kevin Price© Restoration of the Bodyshell continues at Phoenix Motor Bodies:

Continuing on from the last report, Dave Gate of Phoenix Motor Bodies of Wybunbury, Cheshire, CW5

Following my visit of the 17<sup>th</sup> August, my next trip up to Cheshire to see Dave's progress on 71 DXC was on the 13<sup>th</sup> September.

Both sill assemblies had now been welded into position and the

old passenger rear wing removed to reveal the extent of corrosion in the inner wheel arch.

My original plan was to have repaired all four wings but after some consideration I decided that in order to



make sure 71 DXC would survive for another 50 years and also time constrains, it was decided it was best to replace all four wings with new old stock panels.

After a discussion with Dave and my viewing the corrosion in the inner wheel arch it was decided we needed to find a new full outer section of the passenger side wheel arch. A phone call to Simon at Brookhouse came up trumps, In that he had just received the prototype of the new Arch Repair Panel and it was the passenger side.

The Jensen built Cars and up to Chassis No: 8000 have a completely different Bodyshell to the later 1964 Model, so although the arch looked the



same Dave would need to work his magic to get it to fit and meet up with Rear Wing when fitted.

I was pleased to see that great progress had been made in other areas of the bodyshell.

Again, it had been decided to replace the outer front floor pans rather than just repair.







This not only makes replacement of the front outriggers/jacking point easier but also by joining the new panel on top of the Main Chassis Rail, gives access to inside the chassis to check no rust is still present. The great news was that following the SPL Chemical Dipping process inside the main chassis was totally free of corrosion.

The main Chassis Rails and over axle sections on 71 DXC were found to be in excellent condition, considering the car had sat up to the sills in the earth while on that Welsh Hill Farm!







Dave had also repaired the Rear Floor Pans on both sides of the car and replaced the centre Crossmembers on both sides – the Drivers Side of which mounts the Handbrake.

Since my last visit the Drivers Side Rear Wing had been fitted and spotwelded into its final position.

Parts the Rear Panel had also removed to start the repair the boot Floor and inner rear valance.

#### **Kevin Replies:**

Dear Bill, I too had heard that there was to be an introduction of a medical requirement for Renewing your Driving Licence at the age of 70 from July 2025

Having trawled the Internet and eve checked the GovUK Website on how to Renew your Driving Licence at 70, it would appear that up to today 8<sup>th</sup> July 2025 there is still no requirement to undertake a Medical with a Doctor.

With the current situation where it is almost impossible to get a GP Appointment, I know been there with suspected Cancer and only being able to see a Health Care Professional, wo wrongly diagnosed me, I wonder with current GP workload and hours actually at the surgery, how this can even be achieved in addition to the requirements for Medicals for HGV and PCV Licences — which applicant has to pay for as it's a private service. If you have more up to date information please let me know. Kevin

## Drivers over 70 must face two key tests when renewing licence in 2025

Drivers aged 70 and over are set to face two essential health assessments when renewing their driving licences in 2025, as the Government and DVLA have recently clarified. There's a mandatory requirement for seniors to update their licences— fortunately, the renewal is free and can efficiently be completed via the internet. Now, there's discussion about potentially

incorporating cognitive assessments before licence renewals as an additional safety measure on the roads. Moreover, the RAC has issued a warning that if drivers fail to renew their licence and continue to drive, their car insurance would be rendered invalid. This could lead to serious offences with severe consequences such as hefty fines or even having their vehicle seized by the police. It's vital for individuals to disclose any new medical conditions and also affirm their eyesight. The RAC stresses the importance of being truthful about one's health when applying for a licence renewal.

Conditions you must disclose include: Failing to declare a condition or disability that could affect your driving is an offence, and you could be fined up to £1,000. For more guidance on renewing your licence, you can refer to the advice provided by the RAC. The DVLA also provides an online renewal service for convenience, which can be accessed here: https://www.gov.uk/renew-driving-licence-at-70. If you apply online, your new licence should arrive within a week.

Now what has happened to the once must have Volvo Estate? You still see the MK2 and MK3 V70's flying about with the odd V90 but for how much longer? Back in the day there was only 1......the 240!

#### Do any club members still use there 200 as Dailey drivers?

When I was growing up in Plymouth. we had several Antique shops on the Barbican area of the city along with many little interesting shops selling a whole array of things from second hand clothes to expensive paintings, the connection being a lot of them had Volvo estates.

I used to catch the bus into the Barbican to get fish and chips and walk around Volvo spotting, with the strong smell of vinegar in the air. I remember many of them One that stands out more than any other was a bright yellow 245 GLE, black leather with more rips than a teenager's jeans, 4 speed with O/D. Similar to Lovejoy's 265GLE. Sporting a massive roof rack hanging over the windscreen which certainly wasn't a Volvo issue item. More likely off a transit van, modified to fit the Volvo, it had a burgundy driver's side wing and a light metallic petrol blue tailgate with a massive fog light screwed to it, hanging down. The rear arches were in primer, things like this were acceptable back in the early 90's how times change. The car belonged to an antiques dealer and I used to see it all the time never with the rear seats up, a true work horse. 

John De Vries – Designer of the Volvo 480, Volvo's first Front Wheel Drive Car and also the Volvo 300 Series Dies at the age of 80 on 21st June 2025 Kevin Price

It is with great sadness, as the owner of several Volvo 480's, I have to report the death of John De

Vries who was the designer of the Volvo 480 and the Volvo 300 Series

John was born February 18<sup>th</sup> 1945 at Bergeijk, in Holland and started at the Design Department of DAF in Helmond, where he worked on the design of Project 900, the successor of the DAF 66. In 1971, out of two of in-house designs and designs by Giovanni Michelotti and Bertone, De Vries' design was chosen for the car that ultimately became the Volvo 343.

In 1980, the first front wheel drive Volvo was in development, and once again competing with a number of

Italian designs, Volvo in Sweden went for De Vries' design that became the Volvo 480 in 1986. After his work for Volvo, he started to work for DAF Trucks in 1985, where he designed the DAF 95.



Volvo has pioneered a new 'multi-adaptive' seatbelt that could bring significant improvements to in-car safety.

The world's most safety-focused automaker is launching a "smart seatbelt" on the upcoming EX60.

#### Here's how it works.

- Volvo has revealed its new "multi-adaptive seatbelt" design, which increases occupant safety.
- The new seatbelt adjusts depending on the size and weight of the occupant and uses AI.
- The 2026 EX60 will be the first Volvo to feature this seatbelt, but all subsequent models are likely to follow suit.

Volvo's reputation is built around safety. It's the source of many safety innovations, including the three-point seat belt that all cars have today, introduced by Volvo in 1959 as an improvement on the lap strap. That focus is trickier in a world where safety is mandated by strict regulations, but somehow, Volvo manages to stay ahead of the curve.

Al analysing variables such as seat position, the exact specifics of the crash, and the size and weight of the occupant, it can maximize the use of all available safety systems and even predict an accident before it happens, giving the car valuable time to prepare and fine-tune its approach. This all sounds great in theory, but it will be interesting to see if this system works as advertised out of the box or if having multiple systems working together and controlled by AI will be the source of bugs.

Volvo is introducing this feature at a time when vehicles are becoming increasingly dependent on their software. It's a sign that the Swedish manufacturer (owned by China's Geely since 2010) is embracing the software-defined vehicle (SDV) revolution, which is unfolding in parallel with the switch from combustion to electric power. China is the place where most SDV breakthroughs are happening, and through its connection to Geely, Volvo can leverage this to its advantage.
